Man gets 15 years for molesting scouts

Dieter Cathcart, a former scoutmaster who admitted sexually molesting three Boy Scouts in his Maple Shade home, was sentenced yesterday to 15 years in state prison.

Cathcart, 35, pleaded guilty in June to one count of aggravated sexual assault and two counts of criminal sexual contact. A former leader of two scouting troops in Cherry Hill, he admitted that he had performed sexual acts on one boy — now age 15 — between January 1986 and April 1987. He also admitted fondling two scouts, one — now 15 years old — in August 1987 and another — now 16 — in February 1987.

"This is a first-degree charge," Assistant Prosecutor Greg Shivers said yesterday after the sentencing. "This is the most serious sexual charge there is."

Cathcart could have been sentenced to 24 years in prison.

Under the sentence, given by Burlington County Superior Court Judge Victor Friedman, Cathcart — who Shivers described as a "classic pedophile" — will serve his time at the Avenel Adult Diagnostic and Treatment Center, a North Jersey prison for sex offenders.

Friedman ordered that Cathcart, who had no previous criminal record, not be paroled for five years. At Avenel, however, prisoners normally serve out the bulk of their sentences.

"At Avenel, he will most likely do 10 to 15 years," said Shivers.

At the time of Cathcart's arrest last September, Burlington County Prosecutor Stephen G. Raymond said Cathcart would "prey on kids who had some problems." Shivers later said that Cathcart had "befriended the three boys, built up their trust and then molested them."

Cathcart served as the master of former Troop 250 from 1979 to 1987. He served as assistant scoutmaster of Troop 18 from 1987 to March of 1988. Both troops are based in Cherry Hill.

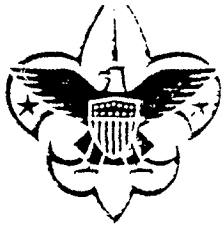

Ex-scoutmaster held in molesting of 3 boys

A former Boy Scout master of two Cherry Hill troops was arrested yesterday by Burlington County authorities and charged with sexually molesting three Camden County scouts.

Dieter Cathcart, 35, of Mount Laurel Road, Mount Laurel, was charged with aggravated sexual assault, two counts of aggravated criminal sexual contact and three counts of endangering the welfare of a child.

According to Prosecutor Stephen G. Raymond, Cathcart allegedly molested the three boys between 1983 and March 1988. The boys, who are now 14, 15, and 16, and live in Pennsauken and Cherry Hill, belonged to Troop 18 and former Troop 250.

Cathcart, a farm maintenance worker, was scoutmaster of Troop 250 from 1979 to 1987 and assistant scoutmaster of Troop 18 from 1987 to March 1988.

He was being held last night in the Burlington County Jail after failing to post \$10,000 bail. If convicted of all charges, Cathcart could be sentenced to up to 30 years in prison.

"He had fairly sophisticated selection process where he would prey on kids who had some problems," said Raymond. "It was not everybody within the troop, but just those who he felt he could take advantage of."

Raymond said the sexual assaults took place at Cathcart's former home on Dana Lane in Maple Shade.

"He would befriend the kids — he even knew the parents — and would invite them [the children] to stay overnight," Raymond said.

Raymond said he is investigating whether there were other incidents involving members of the two troops.

SCOUTMASTER CHARGED — A former scoutmaster for boys in Cherry Hill and Pennamaken is charged yesterday on charges he had sexual relations with at least three of his sons, the youngest being 12 years old at the time. Cathcart, 35, of Mount Laurel, had been sentenced to 30 years in jail if convicted on charges of aggravated sexual assault for the welfare of a child. Cathcart is charged in three indictments in Sussex County Prosecutor Stephen Raymond said, "It is possible there are other victims as seven or eight." Cathcart, who lived in Maple Shade at the

The incidents occurred between 1983 and 1987 and involved boys who were 12 to 16, Raymond said.

Bob Marinucci, field director of the Camden County Council of Boy Scouts of America, said, "To our knowledge, this is the only incident of this kind" involving his council, which has about 130 units in its jurisdiction.
