I am providing this report on the above named at his request for the knowledge and consideration of the boy scout organization. Mr Farley has been a rather well meaning but awkward and in a degenerate individual who has always sought the company of young boys for self build up and - some drinking with us unusual problems.

In a recent incident, he was picked up by police on a suspicion of homosexuality and used bad judgment in another related incident.

In view of his youth and desire to help him self I have advised him very strongly that he should receive psychiatric treatment on a long term basis, frequency to be determined by me and he is fully cooperative. Under these circumstances I would recommend that his job be protected.

Followup visit to Joel Michael Farley completed Saturday, February 9, 1973 by David Borchard, District Executive and LaVerne Wells, District Commissioner at his place of business, Hi-Way Transport, 820 Black Oak Ridge Rd., Wayne, N.J.

1. Stated they were on business. Letter read to him - informing him that B.S.A. chose not to accept his registration as an adult leader. He was also informed that this information would not be shared with anyone. They made no accusations and handed the letter to J.M. Farley.
2. Mr. Farley stated that his intentions were good and that his endeavors in Scouting had always been energetic and that he was interested in helping boys. He asked that his Doctor, [REDACTED] M.D.P.A., [REDACTED], Glen Rock, N.J. 07452 be contacted. (This has been done and the Doctor is writing a statement that he will forward.)
3. Mr. Farley was requested to surrender his Merit Badge Counselor registration card and he willingly complied. He stated that he meant to take action against the Detective who supplied Mr. Borchard with the information. He said he felt no grudge or malice against Mr. Borchard and that he understood the concern of the B.S.A. in cases such as this. He was asked to refer any boys half-way through a Merit Badge subject to another Counselor or to the Council Service Center. He agreed to stop all Scouting activities at this time.

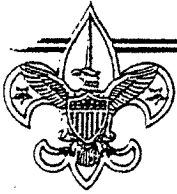

Ptl. Gerrit Kuhnen and [redacted] age 14, [redacted].

[redacted] related to this officer that early this morning after spending the night at his aunt's house in Oak Ridge, New Jersey, he accompanied his aunt, [redacted] to HiWay Transportation in Wayne, where she drives a school bus.

[redacted] further stated that he talked to several bus drivers and became interested in seeing Ramapo High School and a person (driver) told him he had that route. This person was only known to him as Mike, and that his aunt knew this person from being a driver. [redacted] requested permission from his aunt to go with Mike and see Ramapo High School. She told him it would be O.K. and that she would meet him back at the garage later.

Mike took [redacted] to Ramapo on his school runs and also to Oakland. He returned to the garage around 9:15 A.M. and spent [redacted] some time there having coffee and talking. He also played checkers with a Joe Morgan. Michael told [redacted] that he had a chess set at his house at Camp Savio, and if he liked, they could go get it and play.

Michael then took [redacted] in his car up to the Camp where he lives. During the time they were traveling to the Camp, Mike asked him if he had any girl friends and started to talk about sex and whether or not [redacted] had ever had any affairs. During this, Mike opened his fly and exposed himself to [redacted] and asked him if he thought it was big enough.

Upon arrival at the camp, Michael insisted that [redacted] come inside. [redacted] told Michael that he wanted to stay in the car, but Mike still insisted he come inside [redacted] and took him by the arm out of the car.

When they were inside, Mike told him he had a book about sex and would give it to him to read. Mike then attempted to touch [redacted] privates and he became frightened.

He told Mike he wanted to go to the bathroom. After coming out of the bathroom, [Redacted] attempted to leave the house by telling Mike he wanted to walk the dog. Mike finally allowed [Redacted] to take the dog out with him. Upon walking up near the field, Mike entered a cabin to get a book. At this time [Redacted] ran to the [Redacted] house and rang the bell, where he told Mrs. [Redacted] what happened.

12/20/72 Michael Farley was found to be at his residence at Camp Savio by Sgt. John Way. This officer arrived at Camp Savio and advised Michael he was under arrest for Molesting a Juvenile. Michael advised at scene of his rights and transported to headquarters by Sgt. John Way.

Upon questioning Michael, he admitted to attempting to molest [Redacted] at his home at Camp Savio. (see Michael's statement). Joel Michael Farley also admitted to this officer that he has had homosexual feelings for several years and that at times he has gone to Newark, N. J. to make money from persons desiring his attentions.

Farley charged with 2A:170-5 - Soliciting a sexual act.

This morning [redacted] came into the garage around 6:30 A.M. 12/20/72 with her nephew [redacted] mentioned he wanted to see the High School we go to where 60 buses go (Ramapo High School, Franklin Lakes.) That's the school I was assigned to drive for this morning. I offered to take him with me, so he could see the school. His aunt said it would be O.K. at about 7:00 A.M. we left the garage and I did the bus route and took him with me to the High School. At 7:33 A.M. we left Ramapo and went on the bus route for Indian Hills, Oakland. I finished that route at 7:55 A.M. and went to the Ramapo Wigwam Coffee Shop and had coffee. We left there at 8:30 A.M. to start a bus route on Woodside Avenue school for Franklin Lakes. We finished that route at 8:50 A.M.

We returned to the garage at 9:15 A.M.. We spent some time in the garage and met his aunt ([redacted]), Milton Road, Oak Ridge. We had coffee, and he, [redacted] played a couple games of checkers with a Joe Morgan.

I took [redacted] with me at around 10:00 A.M. to my place at Camp Savio to pick up some rock salt and a chess game. On the way up, he was sitting very quietly and I asked him what he was quiet about. He said, "Nothing much." To break the ice I said, have you got any girl friends? He said he did have one down in Florida and a couple his cousin was going to fit him up with. I asked him how he makes out with his girl friends. He said he had gotten a piece about 10 times. I then asked him, aren't you afraid you'll knock them up? He wasn't worried, but his brother had knocked up a couple. It was during this time that I opened my fly and exposed myself and told him if you are this big you have nothing to worry about. He said he was big enough. We drove up to Camp Savio and we went in. After we got in the house, I started to touch him to see if he would get excited. He was getting nervous and said he was getting sick. He asked me for a couple of aspirin and I gave him some. I felt his forehead to see if he had a temperature. He went into the bathroom and came back out. I told him to sit down and I would find this book (Sex and everything you wanted to know about sex). He said he wanted to go for a walk and asked if he could take the dog.




Voluntary statement of JOEL MICHAEL FARLEY continued
